

CAMP DIRECTOR: Ron Roach, Coach Roach is now retired from coaching, but began his career at Norcross High School in 1973. In his 7 years there he won over 100 games, took his team to the state playoffs twice, won the Gwinnett County Championship once and won the 8AAA sub region championship 3 straight years. He is past president of the Gwinnett County Tip-Off Club and is the founder and president of the NW GA Tip-Off Club, which he began in 1986. After leaving Norcross, Coach Roach spent two years at Jefferson High, then moved to Jonesboro High. He then moved back to his hometown of Rome and coached at Adairsville High School. In his first season at Adairsville his team was sub region runner-up. From 2001-2005 he coached at Chattooga, where in 2004, his team qualified for the first time since 1988, for the state tournament. Coach Roach spent 5 years coaching girls and boys teams in grades 5-10 at Duluth where he compiled over 250 victories. He also officiated basketball for over 10 years, and is now an official in the NW Georgia area. Coach Roach was the first girls coach to be selected Coach of the Year by the Atlanta Tip-Off Club in 1979.

ASSOCIATE DIRECTOR: Rick Crowe, Dacula (retired) Assistant girls coach, Lakeview Academy. Coach Crowe is a very capable organizer and versatile coach. In his years in education Coach Crowe has served as Athletic Director and Head Coach of the following sports: football, basketball, track, baseball, cross-country, softball, wrestling, and tennis. He has also officiated football, basketball and baseball. He took his Dacula team to the final four in 1993. He was named Gwinnett County coach of the year in 1991 and 1993. Coach Crowe has been with the Number One Basketball Camp from the beginning and coordinates the camp's activities.

OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR: Hazel Hall, Flowery Branch. Hall has coached high school basketball at the varsity level for 19 years. She has built successful programs at NW Georgia (now Dade Co.), Oconee County and Model High Schools. She has had teams advance to the elite 8 twice and final four once. Coach Hall has been a college assistant at KSU and Reinhardt College. She coached boys for the first time in 2005. She has been on the camp staff since 1986.

OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR: Rick Gasper, Woodstock High School. Prior to his present position, Coach Gasper was the head boys coach at Cherokee High School for 8 years. He has been on the camp staff since 1991.

DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR: Jimmy Williams, Head Boys Coach, East Laurens High School. While at East Laurens, Coach Williams' teams have been to the state tournament for the last 8 seasons. His teams have been the state runner-up twice and been to the elite eight twice. He has been the head coach at Treutlen County and an assistant at Stephens County High Schools. Coach Williams played professionally in Europe and South America. He was a three time honorable mention All-American at North Georgia College and also named Player of the Year while at North Georgia. He was the MVP for three seasons on the All-Marine Corps team. He has been on the camp staff since 1993

ASSISTANT CAMP DIRECTOR: Kelly Polk, Pointe South Middle School. Coach Polk has taught and coached for 25 years in Clayton County. He is presently an assistant principal in Clayton County. Coach Polk coordinates room arrangements, schedules of games and officials. He's been on the camp staff since 1992.

REGISTRATION: Brenau University, Gainesville, GA, in the lobby of Crudup Hall on Sunday, June 6, and June 13 from 1:00—3:00 p.m. July 11th Registration will be in the lobby of the University Dinning Hall from 1:00-3:00 p.m.

CAMP SESSIONS: High School combination camp (fundamentals and team play) (grades 9-12) the weeks of June 6-9, June 13-16. Team play only the weeks of June 6-9 & 13-16 (9-11 games); June 7-9 and June 14-16 (7-8 games). Middle School (grades 6-8) the week of July 11-14. **First Session starts at 3:00 p.m. on first day of camp.**

TIME OF ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE: Campers should arrive on the college campus first day of camp between 12:00 and 2:00 p.m. Orientation is at 3:00 p.m.

Campers should be out of the dorm on last day morning. Teams traveling a long distance can make arrangements to stay an extra day. Call for costs.

DORMITORY SUPERVISION: Qualified members of the staff will supervise the dormitory.

WHAT TO BRING: Each participant should bring workout shoes and clothes, socks, shorts, shirts, swim suit, and personal toilet articles, towels, sheets (single), and pillow. Dorms are air conditioned.

COST FOR RESIDENT CAMPERS: Fundamental campers cost is \$290.00. This covers instruction, insurance, T-shirt, meals, lodging in the dorm, team games and shooting contests. Team play only (Sun.-Wed. 9-11 games) \$500 team fee and \$165 per player (7 meals) or (Mon.-Wed. 7-8 games) \$400 team fee and \$145 per player (6 meals).

Team play only add \$5 for camp t-shirt.

\$100 deposit due prior to May 1st for all campers. The balance may be paid by cash, money order, cashiers check or school check.

Head coach stays free, may be fee for assistants based on number of players.

COST FOR DAY CAMPERS: Fundamental campers cost is \$150.00, meals are not included.

Team play only cost is \$85.00, meals are not included.

These rates are for 5 or more. Individuals accepted on a limited basis—call for more information.

ADMISSION: The camp is open to girls ranging in age from 11 years to rising high school seniors. Instruction and games will be scheduled according to ages.

Individuals who are admitted are expected to conform to proper behavior and to follow rules set by the camp and college. Those who are unwilling to meet these standards will be dismissed.

Campers may not use automobiles during camp, and must turn in keys at registration.

GENERAL INFORMATION: Campers will be housed in air-conditioned dorms and meals are served in the college dining hall.

Also located on campus is a post office, bookstore, snack bar, and student's lounge. The college swimming pool may also be available to campers.

****Do not bring unnecessary valuables as the camp will not be responsible for any lost articles.**

INSURANCE: All campers will be covered by accident insurance (ours is excessive coverage and is used along with the camper's own policy). Medical expenses, which are declined for payment through the campers personal insurance and/or through the excess policy, become the personal responsibility of the camper's parents or guardians.

DIRECTIONS TO BRENAU

From Atlanta

Take I-85 North to I-985 North. Take Exit 22, Gainesville—Jefferson, Hwy. 129. Turn left off of the exit. Follow highway 129 into Gainesville. After crossing Jesse Jewel Parkway, take the 3rd right onto Washington St. At the second stop sign, turn left onto Prior St. Crudup Hall will be the second building on your right.
